Position Title: **Campus Organizer**

Campus Organizers are folks who want to spread the OAG love at their school (high school or college is welcome). The challenge is to engage many other students, and create a social justice research community on your campus. Organizers may introduce OAG to classes, share our zines with student, establish a campus chapter, and encourage students to read the blog and the publications, and ideally to get involved on a greater lever. Organizers in the Seattle area will be required to attend monthly OAG organizational meetings. Here are a few ways to organize for OAG on campus:

- 1) Establish a chapter of OAG at your school. This is a simple way to obtain resources for your organizing, like meeting rooms. We have organizing documents, fliers, posters, etc. that you are welcome to utilize.
- 2) If you attend the University of Washington Seattle campus, you can become an officer of OAG @ UW.
- 3) If you don't want to or can't start a club at your campus, but would like to do organizing work, we can help by delivering whatever resources you need.

Minimum 5 hours /week
